

Places to visit in Delaware

Hagley Museum: the site of the original du Pont Black Powder Mill. <https://www.hagley.org/>

Longwood Gardens: an internationally known garden with fountains and a very large conservatory. <https://longwoodgardens.org/>

New Castle {where William Penn first landed}: Includes a large number of historic homes, including the Little Dutch House which dates back to the landing of the Dutch, the first settlers in Delaware; the George Read house; and Battery Park, a waterfront park with a children's play area, and lots of walking paths. New Castle is also home to many little shops and restaurants. <https://newcastlecivil.delaware.gov/>

The Brandywine River Museum in Chadd's Ford: houses the Andrew Wyeth collection. <http://www.brandywine.org/museum>

The Delaware Art Museum: houses a collection of Howard Pyle's art. <http://www.delart.org/>
